WHAT TO BRING

Please bring to the audition a short resume and a headshot or recent photograph. Young actors should dress in clothes that are conducive to movement and should dress in layers, as the temperature can vary throughout the building.

WHAT TO PREPARE | FOR ALL ACTORS

All actors, regardless of age, should be prepared to sing, acapella, *Twinkle Twinkle Little Star* or *The Alphabet Song*.

WHAT TO PREPARE | FOR ACTORS AGES 11 to 18

Please memorize or be prepared to read one of the short monologues below.
Your monologue should be no longer than 60 seconds.

Oh! But he was a tight-fisted hand at the grindstone, Scrooge! a squeezing, wrenching, grasping, scraping, clutching, covetous, old sinner! Hard and sharp as flint, from which no steel had ever struck out generous fire; secret, and self-contained, and solitary as an oyster. The cold within him froze his old features, nipped his pointed nose, shriveled his cheek, stiffened his gait; made his eyes red, his thin lips blue; and spoke out shrewdly in his grating voice.

OR

Once upon a time—of all the good days in the year, on Christmas Eve—old Scrooge sat busy in his counting-house. It was cold, bleak, biting weather: foggy withal: and he could hear the people in the court outside go wheezing up and down. The city clocks had only just gone three, but it was quite dark already—it had not been light all day—and candles were flaring in the windows of the neighbouring offices, like ruddy smears upon the palpable brown air.

Please memorize or be prepared to read one of the short monologues above.
Your monologue should be no longer than 60 seconds.

Please be prepared to tell a story, no longer than 60 seconds, which includes something that makes you very happy.
