

You might have to wait on your bus for a few minutes before you can enter the theatre.

When you arrive at the theatre,
you will enter through the blue doors.



There are 3 steps to get to the lobby doors.
If you need a ramp, there is one available.




An IRT staff member will lead your group into the theatre.
After your group has been seated in the theatre, you are
welcome to return to the lobby or stay in your seat.




IRT staff will be in the lobby if you need help.
They will be wearing IRT nametags.



The theatre has two floors. If your seat is on the Mezzanine level, you can take the stairs in the Grand Lobby or the elevator (by the Ticket Office) to get upstairs.



The Mezzanine has costume displays from other shows. You can look at the costumes or touch them gently if you would like.



Sensory supports (like a fidget or noise-canceling headset) are available for your show. If you would like one, please talk to your teacher or an IRT staff member.



There are restrooms in the Grand Lobby and on the Mezzanine.

There is one water fountain in the Grand Lobby and one on the Mezzanine.



There are 11 stairs on the Main Floor and 8 in the Mezzanine. These stairs might be longer than other stairs, and you may have to take 2-3 steps before reaching the next stair.



An usher will tell you and your group what seat you will sit in once you are inside. You will sit with your entire group when you are in the theatre.



During the show, you are welcome to exit the theatre, at any time. You might need to wait a few moments before returning to the theatre. An usher will tell you when you can enter the theatre and can walk you back to your seat if you need help.



If you need a break during the performance:

- You can sit in the Grand Lobby where you can watch the show from a television monitor
- You can sit inside the Danner Lounge, where it will be quiet

Sometimes, a play will include a 15-minute intermission. If you are unsure if the show you are seeing has an intermission, you can ask an usher or your teacher. At intermission, you can return to the lobby to:

- Use the restrooms
- Look or touch the displays in the Mezzanine

You are also welcome to stay in your seat.
Please do not sit or stand on the stage.



If the show does have an intermission, a bell will ring when it's time to enter the theatre for the second part.

When the show is over, you are welcome to clap with the other members of the audience as a way to thank the performers, or you can choose not to.



After the show, there will be a post-show discussion. The cast and crew will talk about the show and answer questions.

IRT staff will let your group know when it is your time to leave the theatre.
Your full group will leave at the same time.
