You might have to wait on your bus for a few minutes before you can enter the theatre.

When you arrive at the theatre,
you will enter through the blue doors.



The theatre is on the 4th Floor. There are a few flights of stairs you will take to get to the theatre.
If you need an elevator, one is available.



An IRT staff member will lead your group into the theatre. After your group has been seated in the theatre, you are welcome to return to the lobby or stay in your seat.



IRT Staff will be in the lobby if you need help.
They will be wearing IRT nametags.



Sensory supports (like a fidget or noise-canceling headset) are available for your show. If you would like one, please talk to your teacher or an IRT staff member.



There are restrooms in the lobby.

There is one water fountain in the lobby.




The theatre has 3 seating sections: Left, Right, and Center.

An usher will tell you and your group what seat you will sit in once you are inside. You will sit with your entire group when you are in the theatre.



There are 18 steps in the Center Section and 8 steps in the Left and Right Sections.

These stairs might be longer than others, and you may have to take 2-3 steps before reaching the next stair.



During the show, you are welcome to exit the theatre, at any time. You might need to wait a few moments before returning to the theatre. An usher will tell you when you can enter the theatre and can walk you back to your seat if you need help.




If you need a break during the performance, you can sit in the lobby. There is a television monitor in the lobby where you can watch the show if you would like.

Sometimes, a play will include a 15-minute intermission. If you are unsure if the show you are seeing has an intermission, you can ask an usher or your teacher.

At intermission, you can return to the lobby to :

- Use the restrooms
- Walk around in the lobby

You are also welcome to stay in your seat.
Please do not sit or stand on the stage.



If the show does have an intermission, a bell will ring when it's time to enter the theatre for the second part.

When the show is over, you are welcome to clap with the other members of the audience as a way to thank the performers, or you can choose not to.



After the show, there will be a post-show discussion - people will talk about the show and answer questions.

IRT staff will let your group know when it is your time to leave the theatre.

Your full group will leave at the same time.
